Because of her efforts to put off remarriage, Penelope is often seen as a symbol of conjugal fidelity. But because Athena wants her "to show herself to the wooers, that she might set their hearts a-flutter and win greater honor from her husband and her son than heretofore", Penelope does eventually appear before the suitors (xviii.160–162). Penelope: Penelope, in Greek mythology, a daughter of Icarius of Sparta and the nymph Periboea and wife of the hero Odysseus. They had one son, Telemachus. Homer's *Odyssey* tells the story of how, during her husband's long absence after the Trojan War, many chieftains of Ithaca and nearby islands become her Odysseus is one of the most influential Greek champions during the Trojan War.
